Background:

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), Government of India (GoI) is offering a “One year Post Graduate Diploma in Public Health Management” to the Public Health professionals. The Diploma course has been designed with an aim to develop the capacity of the health practitioners with a focus to bridge the gaps in the public health managerial responsibilities.

This Diploma is being offered by NIHFW, in collaboration Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India and Partners in Population and Development (PPD), Bangladesh, at National Institute of Health and Family Welfare (NIHFW).

LOGISTIC INFORMATION FOR THE PARTICIPANTS NOMINATED BY PPD

1. The Venue and others

Venue : National Institute of Health and Family Welfare
Munirka New Delhi – 110067, India

Location of the Institute ::

It is situated in South Delhi, near Jawaharlal Nehru University and Munirka DDA flats. It is easily accessible from both the Indira Gandhi International Airport and the New Delhi Railway Station, approximately 7 kms, and 15 kms respectively. Pre-paid taxis/auto-rickshaws are available.

2. Accommodation

Adequate hostel accommodation would be provided to the participants only, within the Institute’s campus.

3. **Course Fee** –Government of India will bear the course fee of Rs. 2.50 lakh (Rupees Two Lakhs only) which includes training material, boarding and lodging.

4. Important Dates

5. Pocket expenses:

Government of India will provide Rs. 5000/- (Rupees Five Thousand Only) per month as scholarship amount (out of pocket expenses) to each international sponsored candidate.

6. Ticket

The Travel expenses (to and fro) for joining the course will be met by the sponsoring institution/candidate.

7. Airport Transfer: Pre-paid Taxi can be taken to reach the institute.

8. Insurance

Participants are advised to obtain insurance coverage, either at their own or at their organization's expenses against costs arising out of sickness, accident (including the cost of medical attention), temporarily or permanent disability, death and third-party risks, covering the entire duration of the course and travel time. **PPD and NIHFV will not be held responsible for shouldering such costs during the course.**

9. Visa

Confirmation letters from NIHFV already sent to all candidates. The candidates would be responsible for initiating and obtaining visa process in their respective countries and Visa expenses will be met by the sponsoring institution/candidate. The candidates are requested to apply for their visas as early as possible.

10. Currency and Exchange

The currency exchange rate in India is USD 1= (bank rate) which may fluctuate slightly. You can convert your currency from bank easily. The currency is the Indian Rupee (INR), which is divided into 100 paise (singular paisa). Major currencies can be changed at banks, and authorized bureau de changes

11. Weather:

The climate of New Delhi has subtropical climate with high variation between summer and winter temperatures. The temperature varies from 40 degrees Celsius in summers to around 4 degrees Celsius in winters. New Delhi's version of a humid subtropical climate is noticeably different from many other cities with this climate classification in that it features long and very hot summers, relatively dry cool winters, and monsoon and dust storms. Summers are long, from early April to October, with the monsoon season in between. Winter starts in November and peaks in January. The annual mean temperature is 25 °C (77

°F); monthly mean temperatures range from 14 °C to 33 °C (58 °F to 92 °F. The average annual rainfall is approximately 714 mm (28.1 inches), most of which is during the monsoons in July and August.

12. Others:

Food: The meals (breakfast, lunch, dinner) will be provided at the Hostel.

Internet facility: There is internet connectivity at the Hostel round the clock.

The institute has modern computer /internet facilities in the computer room of NIHFW.
The National Documentation Unit is equipped with latest books for reference.

Time: Local time is GMT +5.5.

Electricity: 240 volts, 50Hz. A variety of power outlets are used in India, but most plugs have two or three round pins.
