




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Introduction

Nurses and midwives representing the largest section of healthcare workforce are the important drivers of any healthcare system. This challenge aims to work with healthcare employers worldwide who between them will enable 20,000 young nurses and midwives to join leadership and development programmes and build their skills as practitioners, advocates and influential leaders in healthcare.
