

Introduction

National Documentation Centre (NDC) was established in the National Institute of Health & Family Welfare (NIHFW) in 1977 by merging two existing libraries of NIHAIE and NIFP. The National Documentation Centre is located in its own building in the campus of National Institute of Health and Family Welfare near Jawaharlal Nehru University, South Delhi.

The National Documentation Centre of NIHFW endeavors to acquire process, organize and disseminate global information to fulfill the information need of the administrators, planners, policy makers, researchers, teachers, trainers, programme personnel and public concerned with public health, population and family welfare throughout the country. The library facilities available at NDC are probably one of the best in India in this field.

The enormous growth of information technology has brought a radical change in the way libraries have been imparting information services to the users. In order to ensure libraries are able to bridge the gap between the two tiered society of “knowledge haves” and “knowledge have-nots”.

It is with this concern, the National Documentation Centre has been conducting training course to equip medical librarians with latest information technologies since the year 2000.

General Objective

To enhance competencies of Health Science Library professionals in modern information technologies and its applications in libraries.
