

Introduction

The Government of India launched the National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) in April 2005 with a goal to improve the availability of and access to quality health care by the people, especially for those residing in the rural areas, the poor, women and children. The NRHM proposed an intensive monitoring and supervision framework through a three pronged process of community based monitoring, external surveys and stringent internal monitoring. A programme was designed and initiated to tackle problems with certain goals and objectives by adopting various appropriate strategies to achieve them. For comprehensive monitoring and evaluation of the programme, improvement in knowledge and skills of personnel involved in monitoring and evaluation through training, greater interaction between programme officers, administrative/finance officers and statisticians and wider dissemination of information up to grass root level workers is necessary. This will also minimize some of the problems related to programme management.

In order to improve the skills of the health professionals for monitoring of National Health Programmes including NHM, the National Institute of Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi has planned to organise a training course on “Monitoring and Evaluation of National Health Programmes including NHM”.

General Objective

To enhance the competence of state/district level health officials in monitoring and evaluation for improved monitoring and evaluation in States/Districts of National Health

Programmes including NHM and management of COVID initiatives.

Specific Objectives

At the end of training participants would be able to:

- Describe conceptual framework relating to M&E and Supportive Supervision in National Health Programmes including NHM and management of COVID initiatives.
- Discuss various concepts and techniques of monitoring and evaluation including surveillance.
- Describe use of information available in HMIS and MCTS portals for monitoring of National Health Programmes including NHM
- Discuss the concept and methods of participatory monitoring and evaluation.
- Discuss and use log-frame approach as monitoring tool.
- Discuss the use of M&E results for policy and planning purposes.
- Develop brief plan of action for strengthening capabilities of district level functionaries in monitoring & supportive supervision in their respective states of National Health Programmes including NHM

Course Outcome

This training course is expected to enhance the competence of state level officials/trainers in the preparation of district/state level plan of action for monitoring under National Health Programmes including NHM. The course will also be helpful to undertake the situational analysis of monitoring and evaluation (M&E) system in place under National Health Programmes including NHM in various States and to plan appropriate training of the officials at various levels in M&E.

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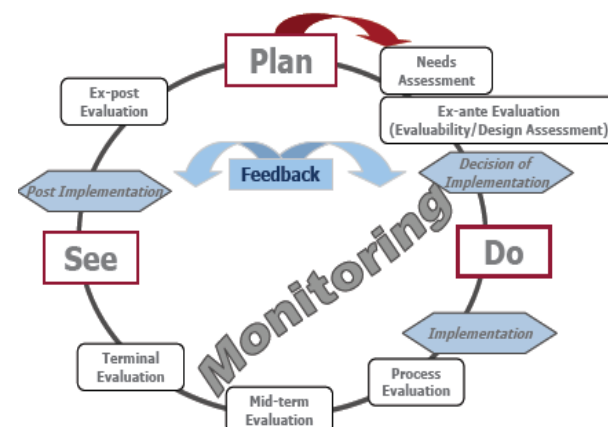
